Indicative Sanctions Guidance – Registrants

In deciding the sanctions, all parties must ensure that any sanction imposed is proportionate and reasonable having balanced the interest of the Registrant and the public interest. The sanction imposed should always be the least severe sanction which deals adequately with the identified issues whilst protecting the public interest. If a lack of evidence prevents full review and appropriate action, any panel can request the PPO to gather more evidence before making a decision.
